

Walk 2 - Longfield, Whitpot Hill and Bagg Lane

At the bottom of the station approach, turn left up the hill. Cross the railway over the bridge and continue uphill in the sunken lane until you emerge through a gate into the byway that runs through Longfield. The gate on the left affords beautiful views to Coldgear woods and the hills and river beyond. At the top of the hill, the overgrown area to your left used to be the village reservoir. The track now passes through what is thought to be the remains of an Iron Age hill fort before entering the field itself. A granite seat on your right commemorates a local farming family who lived in Treboul House.

Continue along the track with its views over the Lyner estuary to the south and north to Bodmin Moor. Down to your left as you near the end of Longfield can be seen Treboul House. This was built to replace one in St Germans that had to be demolished to make way for the railway. As you emerge onto the public highway turn right down Whit Pot Hill. This beautiful sunken lane passes under a low arch rail bridge before joining Bagg Lane where you turn right to return to the village.
